



Royal Oak Master Plan Summary of Charrette Input

July 7, 2023

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Summary

This chapter is a summary of feedback that the consultant team received both before and during the week-long Master Plan charrette. During that visioning process, feedback was collected from stakeholders in the primary areas of focus: Overall Vision, Neighborhood Amenities, Activity Centers, Housing Options, Getting Around, and Natural Systems. The responses to those prompts that have been summarized in this chapter are just a piece of what the consultant team has heard. Those comments on

blue backgrounds in the following pages were summarized from the 1,300+ open-ended survey responses, and those on orange backgrounds were gathered through the weeklong charrette process. This section is meant to supplement the input that was presented to the planning commission on March 14, 2023.

An additional appendix will be provided with all comments received throughout the charrette process.







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Vision

As part of the vision of the master plan, and as an introduction to the master plan process, stakeholders were asked for their input regarding their overall vision for the future of Royal Oak. The feedback we received has been summarized on the following pages.

What is most important for you about the future of Royal Oak?

Bike and pedestrian only routes










Are you concerned with home prices or rents?




Would you walk or bike more if it were more convenient?




Where should biking be encouraged? Answered: 45




Would you take public transportation if it were convenient?


How important is it to easily walk to coffee shop or small store close to your home?




How important is it to easily walk to a park close to your home?



The Day 2 Open House Survey was completed by 30 participants and includes a good age distribution, but few younger people.


Which Royal Oak district do you live in?


What is your age?


How long have you lived in Royal Oak?


Do you use bikeshare in Royal Oak?




Should bikeshare stations be added at more parks?

What is your top concern about accessory dwellings?




Where are accessory dwellings most appropriate?


What scale is appropriate for neighborhood main streets? (e.g. 13 Mile & Campbell)


What scale is appropriate for Delemere?




What scale is appropriate for 11 Mile?



The Day 3 Open House Survey was completed by 50 people and includes a broad spread of ages, however participants skewed significantly older than the prior days.


Which Royal Oak district do you live in?


What is your age?


How long have you lived in Royal Oak?


What do you most use Woodward for now?




Which users should Woodward improvements be focused towards?

Do you feel safe driving along or across Woodward?






Do you feel safe walking along or across Woodward?


Should Woodward have less retail?


Do you feel safe driving along or across Woodward?


What Woodward improvements are most needed?




Where are townhouses most appropriate?

What is your top concern about townhouses?






Which Royal Oak district do you live in?


What is your age?


What is the biggest barrier for you to take transit?


What keeps you from biking more, or at all?




Are there sufficient amenities for you in Royal Oak?








Are there sufficient amenities for you in your neighborhood?


Are there sufficient amenities for you in Downtown?
